

Jeff Flippo joined the Aldie Vol. Fire Dept. as a 14 yr. old junior member in March of 1968. He has risen through the ranks and has served in numerous positions through the years including Assistant Chief.

In January 1976, he was hired as a fire/rescue dispatcher for Loudoun County Fire and Rescue. In January of 1977, he was promoted to fire inspector in the Fire Marshal's office. One year later he was promoted to fire investigator. Jeff served in that capacity for several years before being promoted to Lieutenant in the FMO. Several years later he was promoted to Captain of the Special Operations Division supervising investigations, explosives, bombings, etc. while overseeing the development of the Loudoun County Hazardous Material team and the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). In 1994, he was promoted to Chief Fire Marshal in Loudoun County. During this time (1994-2004) he was responsible for the development and implementation of the FBI accredited Loudoun County Bomb Squad and the Fire Marshal K-9 division which consisted of two Explosives dogs, one Accelerant and one bloodhound tracking dog. The Fire Marshal Division grew from 3 personnel to 15 during his tenure.

Jeff has served as President of the Northern Virginia Joint Committee on Fire and Arson, the Shenandoah Valley Joint Committee on Fire and Arson, the Virginia Chapter of the International Association of Arson Investigators, the Virginia State Firefighters Association and Vice President of the Virginia Fire Prevention Association.

He has served on numerous legislative committees over the years and has been credited with a proclamation from the Virginia General Assembly with getting 10 fire prevention & Arson related bills passed into law during his career. Jeff was recognized in 2004 with the Governor's Award for Excellence in Fire Prevention and was honored the same year as a life member of the Virginia Fire Prevention Association.

Jeff retired in 2004 and has continued to be active in fire and life safety prevention as a part time Assistant Fire Marshal for the Frederick County Fire Marshal's Office in Winchester and part time with the Loudoun County Public School System as a Safety and Security Specialist. He is the current Vice President of the Aldie Vol. Fire Department and this year is celebrating his 50th anniversary with the Department.
